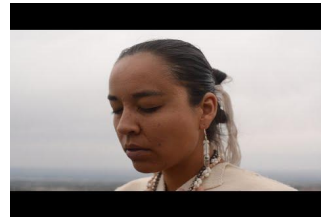

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54% of American Indians and Alaska Natives live in rural and small town areas

“Many Native scholars have argued that living on or near Native homelands or reservations – physical places with cultural meaning – has a strong effect on an individual’s identity and self-esteem because individuals feel proud of their racial and ethnic heritage. Physical place plays an important part in developing and maintaining an identity as an individual, as a member of a community, and as a member of a racial or ethnic group.” - Sarah Dewees & Benjamin Marks

American Indian Studies in Wisconsin Act 31

Requires all public school districts and pre-service education programs to provide instruction on the:

- History
- Culture
- Tribal Sovereignty

of Wisconsin's eleven federally-recognized American Indian nations and tribal communities.
